ADVOCACY ON SMALL RUMINANTS ANIMAL HEALTH, PRODUCTION AND WELFARE IN RURAL AREAS OF GJIROKASTER REGION-SOUTHERN ALBANIA

AIMS

Overall objective was to increase food production and diversification of the farming system so as to attain food security in Gjirokaster region, through empowered and sustainable small ruminants' value chain and improved policy framework.

Specific objectives were to:


- 1. Build advocacy Coalition infrastructure for sustainable animal health & production issues.
- 2. Influence local governments to allocate funds for small ruminants vaccination and compensation for all animals resulted positive.
- 3. To influence and support the decision makers of municipalities for the animal health and welfare strategy preparation and implementation.
- 4. Raising awareness of the women and young farmers on the animal welfare, sustainable animal production, and environment.

ACTIVITIES

- 1.1 Coalition establishment
- 1.2 Training of Coalition members and six journalists on advocacy and lobbying principles.
- 1.3 Round tables with decision makers for the policy improvement of zoonosis and animal welfare
- 2.1 Needs assessment of the animal health and welfare situation in four municipalities to serve as bases for the animal health strategy.
- 2.2 Training the veterinarians for the animal health and welfare strategy
- 2.3 On-job training and animal health and welfare strategy preparation for four municipalities
- 2.4 Round table with decision makers
- 3.1 Women and youth trainings on Animal Welfare, National Minimum Standards and environmental issues.

RESULTS

- 1. A Coalition of stakeholders (veterinarians, NGOs journalists and others) is established and trained in order to advocate animal health and welfare measures to local and national decision makers.
- 2. Four research-based animal health and welfare strategies for four municipalities were created in a participatory manner and approved by the local governments.
- 3. During 2018 all sheep were vaccinated against Brucelosis as a result of the work of the Coalition.
- 4. Veterinarians, representatives of local and regional institutions were included in the development of local animal health and welfare strategies.
- 5. Women and young farmers were trained on animal welfare, national minimum standards, sustainable agriculture and environmental protection

PROJECT "IN NUMBERS"

- 180 people participated in the kick-off meetings where project was introduced.
- 30 people participated in the establishment of the Coalition.
- 30 Coalition members and 6 journalist were trained on lobbying & advocacy.
- 150 participants took part in three round tables with decision makers
- 25 veterinarians of Gjirokaster region were trained on how to prepare the strategy of the animal health and welfare.
- 60 people participated in the round table to approve the strategies.
- 80 women and young farmers were trained on animal welfare and sustainable agriculture.
- 13150 project and policy improvement leaflet printed and distributed
- 3 TV stations broadcasted project results.
