

RESULTS

AIMS

The overall objective was to facilitate high nature value farming and encourage farmers to protect and enhance the environment on their farmland through dialogue on the models of land consolidation.



The specific objectives were to:

- Create pre-conditions for an evidence-based national-level discussion on the land consolidation, by creating a land consolidation model for the Fier Municipality;
- 2. Develop policy discussion with all relevant stakeholders and advocate for the changes in the national draft strategy on land consolidation by providing evidence-based recommendations;
- 3. Identification and implementation of best practices for high nature value farming that support the increase of organic products and land conservation and the farm environment;
- **4. Raising awareness** by publicizing the land fragmentation issue and its consequences.

## ACTIVITIES



1. The research-based programme of agricultural land consolidation of Fier Municipality was created in a participatory manner, approved by Fier Municipal Council and its implementation began. The programme can be used as a model for other municipalities in Albania.

- 2. National Strategy of Land Consolidation improved with recommendations developed and advocated during the project, which is to enable land consolidation in all rural parts of Albania.
- **3. Stakeholders were included** in the development of Consolidation program for Fier municipality and recommedations for improving a National Strategy of Land Consolidation.
- 4. A model for high nature value farming developed and distributed to stakeholders via booklets.
