AIMS

The overall objective was to contribute to development of sustainable agriculture by strengthening NGOs and other key actors' capacity in Zlatiborski, Raški and Podunavski districts to advocate for public policy enhancement at the local and national level.

The specific objective was to promote and support organic agriculture development in Serbia by advocating for introduction and consistent application of research-based public policies, support measures and subsidies in Raški, Zlatiborski and Podunavski districts, targeting decision makers, farmers and consumers.

ACTIVITIES

- 1.1 Scientific research cost benefit and competitiveness analyses of organic agriculture production in Central and Western Serbia
- 2.1 Facilitated advocacy meetings of local stakeholders about the benefits of conversion to organic and sustainable agriculture
- 2.2 Advocacy campaign in villages and local communities for promotion of organic agriculture in Central and Western Serbia
- 3.1 Training in organic agriculture for local farmers from Central and Western Serbia
- 3.2 Peers presentation in local communities with trained farmers presenting information related to organic agriculture
- 4.1 Final National Event in the framework of the National Convent for following the Chapter 11
- 5.1 Visibility activities of the project including press conferences, booklet for decision-makers and farmers, leaflets, etc.

RESULTS

- 1. Memorandum understanding committing to allocating 3% of the local agricultural budget to organic agriculture was signed by four local self-governments: Kraljevo, Uzice, Velika Plana and Arilje.
- 2. Increased knowledge of local farmers about conversion to organic agriculture, organic production methods, networking of farmers, and organic food market through trainings and peer presentations that had widened the number of informed farmers.
- 3. Produced evidence, in a form of a scientific research, about benefits of conversion to organic agriculture, which was used in project advocacy efforts at local level.
- 4. Local community was involved in all stages of the the project including research and advocacy efforts to amend local policies.
- 5. Sustainable agriculture principles and organic production positioned higher on the National Convent's Agenda, within the working group for following Chapter 11 (WG11) Agriculture and Rural Development, and among local and national stakeholders.

PROJECT "IN NUMBERS"

- 12 farmers participated in focus group regarding organic agriculture perspectives
- 200 consumers from targeted territory filled in online questionnaire
- 8 public servants / decision makers from targeted territory participated in research related interview
- 30 pages minimum of Study report produced, with summary and abstract
- 4 local governments signed Memorandum of understanding about support to organic agriculture development
- 10 media reports about project results broadcasted on local media and social networks
- 6 meetings with farmers held in local communities across Serbia
- Training curriculum produced implemented - 3 days of learning at organic farm "Agrikultura Orlovic"
- farmers and interested persons participated at training
